Auditions for *Jitters* – by David French - directed by Bryn Rowlands, will be held at the Dartmouth Players theatre on Wednesday Sept. 5 and Thursday Sept. 6 from 7:00 to 9:30 PM. *Jitters* is a warm-hearted, lively and truly hilarious examination of backstage shenanigans by one of Canada's leading playwrights. Dealing with the trials and tribulations of a provincial theatre company as it approaches opening night of its latest production, the play will strike a responsive chord with all who have suffered through this agonizing/exhilarating process. There are 3 women and 6 men in the play. It features a leading lady in her late 40's and 2 leading men of about the same age. The director, playwright and stage manager are all men in their 30's. The ASM is a woman likewise in her 30's. The young up- and-coming male actor and the Front of House Girl Friday are both in their 20's.

Jitters will run for 13 performances Nov. 7-24, 2007. For the individual auditions you will be reading selections from the play, or you can bring your own prepared piece, or both.

Nunsense

Thanks to all you great Dartmouth Players fans, we've done it again – another highly successful run of the musical comedy “Nunsense,” by Dan Goggin, directed by Geoff Ball.

In November 2006, the show was incredibly popular, having been seen by 1925 people, an all-time DP record by hundreds. It was critically acclaimed as well, including such accolades as “Best bang for the buck...good fun well done, and a amazing value at \$12 per ticket” by Kate Watson,



entertainment critic for The Coast, in her year-end evaluation of theatre in HRM for all of 2006. Many theatre-goers were unable to obtain tickets.

So...we decided to bring “Nunsense” back August 16th to 26th, 2007. As far as we know, this is the 1st time Dartmouth Players has staged a major production in “high summer,” before Labour Day. Thank you, air-conditioning!

From the November cast, Carole Ball returned as The Reverend Mother; Valerie Bellamy was recast as Sister Amnesia; the other three sisters were new to this production: Lori Errington as Sister Hubert, Mistress of the Novices; Karen Shewbridge as Sister Robert Anne; Rose Allen as Sister Leo, Novice.

Lori Errington was also Musical Director, while Valerie Bellamy “double-hatted” with the Choreography. We were very fortunate to have Nhat-Viet “Toto” Phi, an incredibly skilled, highly trained professional musician, as Accompanist. Check his biography at www.phifamily.com.

With a rehearsal period half the length of the usual, the learning curve for this cast and crew was more like a rock cliff than a hill! The amount of energy, dedication, skill, and rigorous work they put in during 4 long rehearsals per week was truly awesome to watch. They were a director’s dream come true!

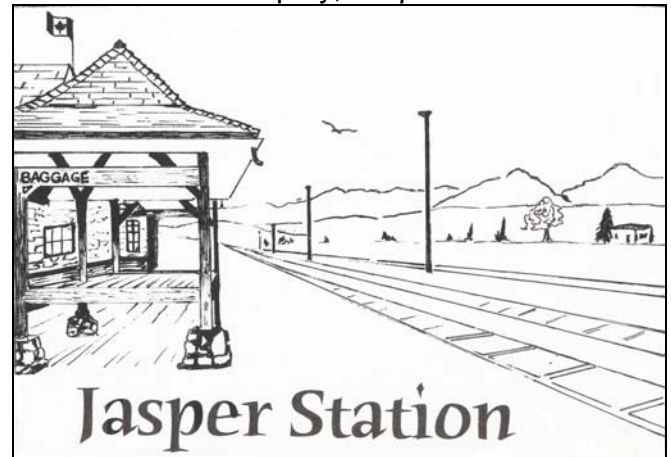
The results? Excellent, professional-level performances, consistently “bringing down the house” at all nine shows and receiving rave reviews.

First of all, our August production of a re-run of the hilarious comedy "NUNSENSE" brought back by popular demand. Following shortly after, in mid September, the play, "PATCHES" brought to us by Saint Mathew's Players for a three day run including an opening night gala with a complimentary glass of wine and munchies. Our main subscription season begins in November with the hilarious "back stage" comedy "JITTERS" directed by Bryn Rowlands. This is followed by our January blues breaker "GOOD THINGS", a romantic comedy directed by me. Our spring selection is a warm hearted edgy drama "A CLEAN HOUSE" directed by Geoff Ball followed by our June production, "SPITFIRE GRILL" a musical, directed by Ian MacDermid. The Dartmouth Players are a registered charity and support other charities through their "Dress Rehearsal for Charities Program". Our Audience Speaks

Patrons to our theatre are well aware of the sponsors quiz and door prizes available each night during our main productions. Each quiz has a space for audience comments. We appreciate your comments, we read them and try to distribute them to all of the cast, crew and board members.

Here is a recap of some of your comments:

- A lot of favourable comments concerning the play, the acting/singing and the set; we thank you for your kind words.
- A number of people stated this was their first time here, and they would be back.
- Some comments concerned scents and perfume worn by other patrons. We advertise a scent-free area, and have included a request for scent-free in our program, newsletter and pre-show announcements.
- We asked the audience to suggest plays to be presented in the future. Your remarks were passed on and considered by our play-reading committee (who are responsible for selecting the next year's plays)
- Several people expressed desire for more spacious seating, or for improved visibility. Although we sympathize with these two concerns, we cannot move the seats further apart without sacrificing the number of patrons we can accommodate in our limited space. We have, however, added cushions to many of the chairs in an attempt to make them more comfortable.
- There were comments about reserved seating. We phoned the people that asked the question to try to explain our policy. Patrons with special needs are asked to identify special needs requirements when they make reservations, and we attempt to accommodate them as best we can. Special needs include visual, hearing and mobility impairments. Wheelchairs are positioned by the exit doors in the front row.
- The lower doors are reserved for those with advanced tickets. We attempt to open these doors forty minutes before curtain so that the advance ticket holders have an advanced pick of seating. The stage manager has the final say as to when the doors open and will try to have the theatre ready for opening at the advertised time.

These are responses to some of your comments. Keep the comments coming; we will evaluate and address wherever possible.
