ABOUT THE PLAY: This is a fast paced comedy with a few twists. It ostensibly reviews the concept of 'ART' as it relates to individual perception and interpretation, but it also examines the impact of varying degrees of personal growth on relationships over the course of time. It makes for intense and hilarious interpersonal patter among three very different personalities. We have been fortunate to cast three community theatre veterans for this project: Frank MacLean (Marc), Phil Reid (Serge) and Terry Coolen (Yvan.)

At Dartmouth Players, we include a sponsor's quiz with the program for the enjoyment of our audience and to introduce you to our sponsors. There is a space on the quiz for the audience to make comments to us, to give us feedback. The following is a summary of those comments

PERFUME PERFUME PERFUME:

The scents that make no sense when you plan to go to an area that is enclosed; like a theatre, church, restaurant, etc. Dartmouth Players has a no-scent policy, and we ask our patrons not to overly indulge in perfume when coming to the theatre. During the run of this play, three ladies left the theatre at intermission because they were bothered by the unpleasant smell of someone's perfume, which caused them to have difficulty breathing. There were many comments written about the bothersome perfume during most of the plays. We ask you to take this into consideration before coming to our theatre.

A comment was made about assigning seats as is done in the professional theatres. This would be a cumbersome venture, which would result in a huge increase in ticket costs. As Dartmouth Players is completely run by volunteers, we would have to hire a staff to manage the tickets and sort through the tickets at the box office resulting in a slow line-up during admission. Also, the cost of printing tickets would drastically increase. The present system will remain in effect for now.

We received a number of comments from those who enjoyed doing the quiz while waiting for the play to commence.

As expected, there were a great number of comments regarding the comfort and the look of the new seats. For this play, there were lots of first time attendees, who enjoyed the play so much they promised to return. They mentioned the friendliness of the staff, and one person who came without a reservation was made to feel welcome and did get a seat.

A quote from one of the comments: "This was fun. Thanks. It had you chatting as well to those seated near you."
